	 The inclusion support program is a national program funded by the federal government It provides support for eligible early childhood education 	sent to Kim to distribute to members of the Working Group

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Details

- The focus of the program is to work within the whole environment, not just with an individual child
- Diversity is acknowledged and respected
- Children with an intellectual issue are helped to be included in the early childhood group to which they belong
- The benefits of inclusion can be seen both in the children with difficulties and their peers, Both groups benefit from interaction with each other.
- 100 people are employed in the program currently.
 800 early childhood services are available in Sydney
- The teams work to help educators make changes to allow all children to be included in activities
- The program can also provide access to specialist equipment to support inclusion
- All workers are early childhood or primary teachers
- Some have additional qualifications.
- All are skilled in assisting children with additional needs
- On line support can be offered in addition to in person help
- Financial support is available at short notice to employ an educator when a child with additional needs attends a centre – could be intellectual disability, newly arrived migrant with no English etc. This support is for when an unexpected situation arises
- A subsidy is also available to provide an additional educator when a child is diagnosed as having a particular need.
- From July 2016 funding has been available to overcome a barrier through a means other than employing someone
- Eg support for children from other cultures through a bicultural worker who increases the skills of the regular educators
- Support is also provided for children with challenging behaviour
- If trauma related, a psychologist may be engaged to train the staff with how to interact with the child
- Family Day Care top up provides a fee top up to someone who is caring for a child who needs extra assistance.
- Normally a family day care provider can take 4 children. If they take a child who needs extra help,

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5	a top up to the equivalent value is provided if they can only care for 3 children as one needs extra assistance, - A specialist equipment library will lend equipment that may be required eg walking frame etc Planning for Social Inclusion Week
