	t Speaker: Community Harmony – Dr Bin Lin and Mr Chris ruyne. Master Ho was also in attendance.		
Mr Ch	ris De Bruyne, provided the following details.		
	In 2019 Chris De Bruyne was in Eastwood and observed a speech by Drew Pavlou, who made a statement against the leader of CPP. As Mr Pavlou was speaking, many members of the public began shouting, swearing and attacking him. Mr De Bruyne was shocked by this behaviour, not only at the violence but also the lack of action by bystanders. Mr De Bruyne Chris suggested that Council needs to do something more than erect anti-racism signs to stop the violence that was shown on this day. It was also noted that the incident in 2019 was not an isolated one. He stated that recently, elements of the Chinese community have been spreading propaganda in regard to the recently announced Korea Town amongst sections of the Chinese community. Sue advised that Council has commenced bystander racism training, as most people do not know what to do when confronted by incidents such as described above. To date this training has been well attended by community members. Mr De Bruyne stated that many people want Council to reconsider the matter raised at Council in July 2019 when the resolution of Simon Zhou was successful in stating that only Chinese people, not the whole community is to be consulted in certain matters. It was suggested that consultation instigated by Council needs to be open to all the public and that this working group and staff need to come up with recommendations about how Council consults on issues in the community. A question was raised as to whether the attack on Mr Pavlou has been taken up by any outside government agencies and did anyone in the community approach Foreign Affairs, etc. This matter has been raised with Federal Government

	Mr De Bruyne suggested that any discussions about Hong Kong should be open to all people not just the Chinese community. A question was asked, as to whether this working group should be involved in this type of political issue. A suggestion to Council is that all discussions are open to all and never restricted to one demographic of the community. The following recommendation was agreed to by the working groups members- 'Council investigates ways to enhance social cohesion and community harmony in Ryde and ensures that consultation is undertaken with the broader community and is open to everyone'.		
5. Gues	st Speaker: Council for Intellectual Disability- Rohan Coleman		
	An overview of the Council for Intellectual Disability (CID) was provided and how they support people with an intellectual disability. CID is a non-government organisation, that has been operating for 65 years. CID works as an advocate for people, campaigns to government, conducts workshops and provides resources for people with a disability and their support networks. The Council wants to address 3 of the barriers faced by its clients being: inclusion in government communications, safety on public transport and to for employment positions in the public sector. Your Service Your Rights is a peer group, which meets monthly to connect people and to allow them to be mentored and be a mentor. Our Rights Project supports decision making and helps then navigate NDIS services. Health projects aim to remove inequity of health outcomes faced by people with intellectual disability. At present, many people with an intellectual disability only work in ADE's – formerly Sheltered Workshops. The above project aims to get them into more general workplaces. The More than Just a Job Project is partnered with COR, when Council will be delivering inclusive training to stakeholders. Looking for volunteers i.e. people with disability to join the More than a Job Project especially those from CALD communities.	The information was noted.
