



Peak period congestion impacts business *Lane Cove Road average speed is 15 km/h in peak




Multi-modal trips reduce congestion

Carpooling also has social appeal, fostering camaraderie and building a happier, more integrated workforce.




44.3% of Macquarie Park employees fall in the key bracket for car share programs: 18-34 years.

8 bike mentors




