Continue to financially support Connect	
 Embellishment planting along Waterloo Road is problematic due to uncertainty regarding priority bus lanes along Waterloo Rd – will plant along Waterloo Rd only between Khartoum and Herring Roads 	
 Expand multi-function poles network along Lane Cove Road (Waterloo to Talavera Roads) 	
 Develop a public art strategy for Macquarie Park – provide guiding principles for developers and Council for public art in public spaces 	
• A car parking trial will occur at approx. 30 sites in Macquarie Park (Lyon Park Rd, Byfield St, Giffnock Ave and Eden Park Drive). The six month trial will commence in March 2017. The current parking meters will be changed to incorporate this change; logistics are still being finalised.
