3. MQU Development Tour		
Property Manager for Macquarie University, Mr. Mark Broomfield lead the Forum on a tour of the Central Courtyard precinct, which is the heart of the Campus.	The information was

4. Venture Café and Incubator Update		
Manager of the MQU Incubator Ms. Melissa Ryan provided a presentation on the goals, aspirations and achievements of this facility.	The information was noted.	
The MQU Incubator provides support and guidance to start ups inside and outside the University.		
It was highlighted that for Australia to prosper, we need to innovate. 50% of economic growth in OECD countries is from new business innovation.		
The 2020 report card for the Incubator's performance is impressive: • Supported 74 Startups since opening in 2017		
31% of its startups have at least 1 female founder		
• 51% founders are MQ Alumni		
Resident Companies generated over 30 new jobs in 2020		
Onboarded 19 new mentors – local and international		
It was noted, Venture Café going forward is being managed by Melissa and her team.		

5. Connect and MPID Update		
General Manager of Connect Mark Ames provided an analysis of traffic data, as well as an update on programs and events being delivered by Connect.	The information was noted.	
Mr Ames highlighted traffic data indicates workers are coming back to the Precinct; however, single vehicle trips are trending up. Congestion on key roads such as Epping and Lane Cove Roads is now back to pre- pandemic levels.		
Mr Ames emphasised all businesses need to continue to promote flexible working and the use of public transport.		
Connect has produced two documents which provide advice and guidance to businesses as they navigate a changing landscape:		
Connect – 'Finding the Path Forward' Connect – 'Hybrid Toolkit'		
Mr Ames also provided an update on discussions between MPID and Connect as they streamline their services. It was noted, there is strong synergy between the goals of both organisations.		
Key Pillars of the plan to streamline their resources is summarised below:		
Transform – Advocacy + Strategy Move – Mobility + Access Thrive – Innovation + Commercialisation Elevate – Marketing + Promotion Unite – Activation		
6. Macquarie Park Marketing Update		
Ms Jan Bouhali, Economic Development Coordinator for Ryde Council provided an update on the Macquarie Park Marketing Plan.		
Council, in collaboration with Connect and MPID delivered a MedTech and Cyber Security Summit on 29 April.	The information was noted.	
As part of the Macquarie Park Marketing Plan, online content is being produced to expand our marketing channels. An invest Macquarie Park video was featured, with other footage being created - the video has attracted over 6500 views.		
It was agreed by developers and commercial real estate agents that such resources will be invaluable when attracting tenants to the Precinct.		
It was agreed to maximise the reach of such resources, marketing collateral should be made accessible to all relevant parties.		
Ms Bouhali also provided information regarding the 'Love Macquarie Park' program. This program highlights what there is to 'see and do' in Macquarie Park and it is focussed on both current and future employees.

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7. General Business		
Key discussions and comments are noted below:		
Tony Abboud informed the meeting he will be meeting with Ms Amy Brown, CEO of Investment NSW in the coming weeks to discuss business opportunities.	The information was noted.	Mr Abboud to report back to the convenor on the meeting
Mark Ames concurred Invest NSW is an important stakeholder for Macquarie Park. He suggested that a delegation of stakeholders from the Forum should request a meeting – he recommended we travel into the city to maximise Ms Brown's availability.		Mr Ames to explore the feasibility of a meeting with Investment NSW.
Mark Broomfield confirmed that the MOU between Sydney FC and MQU is progressing well.		
Mr Broomfield also confirmed that Sonic Healthcare and Macquarie Private Hospital will deliver a COVID vaccination centre at the University.		
Councillor Bernard Purcell passed onto the Forum a request for a prayer space in Macquarie Park by the Islamic Science and Research Academy. They are seeking the space gratis as a not for profit, or for a peppercorn rent.		
Mark Broomfield voiced his support that the Forum should explore opportunities to assist in finding such a space.		
John Brown confirmed Council had hosted a meeting with key landowners and tenants to discuss the proposed design for the Macquarie Park Transport Interchange.		Mr Brown to circulate the letter.
At that meeting, Council presented an alternate design which it believes will provide a better place outcome.		
Council will write to the Transport Minister raising its concerns; the letter will be circulated, and next steps considered.		
There was unanimous agreement that any alternate design that could improve safety, connections and provide a sense of place should be investigated.
