	Item 3.3 - The battle of Lone Pine will be commemorated in August not November.		
	Update on status of local memorials and works to be undertaken		
	Barry Hodge advised the committee of the works to be carried out at the various memorials throughout the local area prior to ANZAC Day 2015. Works will include: cleaning of stonework, replanting of gardens, replacement of gravel, repointing of mortar joints etc. All memorials will then be listed for routine maintenance each twelve months to ensure that a high standard of appearance is maintained.	Barry to arrange examination of the memorial at Meadowbank by Council's stonemason. Necessary works to be carried out if minor. The memorial plaques at Meadowbank have some stones missing – A check to be made of the country of origin for the missing stones and enquiries made as to obtaining replacement stones.	
3.0	Update on Grant Submission – ANZAC Federal Government Grant		
	Derek advised that in January he had been asked to resubmit the grant application and provide additional information. The application was resubmitted with a revised request for funding of \$35,000.00.		
	Betty Willis confirmed that the federal grant applied for by the Historical Society has been received but that the process had been a long one.

ANZAC Park.

It was noted that these funds will be used to provide the plaques intended to be installed. Council has also approved funding for this park which can be used to upgrade the walkway where the plaques are to be installed.

A decision must be made as to the detail to be included on the plaques (12) to be installed. A decision regarding the location of the plaques (in the walkway or on edge) must also be made.

Suggestions for the plaques included: a dedication to nurses, the reproduction of a letter from a mother, a poem.

Installation of the plaques should be carried out on important commemorative dates – November 2015 is suggested for the installation of the first plaque.

Local schools should be included when commemoration services are arranged.

4.0 Street sign installation update

Derek advised that the majority of signs have been installed. Positive feedback has been received from residents. A sign is required at the corner of Chauvel and Blaymey Streets North Ryde.

The completion of the installation of the signs is to be publicised in the local press.

Derek to ensure that a certificate is issued to the Light Horseman who appeared in the press story regarding installation of the signs. The certificate to be signed by The Mayor and Clr Laxale.
