Examples of current food guides were given including one on the website for Strathfield Council. The cost of preparing a food guide in other localities was provided. The cost varied widely depending on whether outside consultants prepare the guide, format of information etc. Skilled migrant program: A partnership between Macquarie University, Meadowbank TAFE, Eastwood CCA, Federal Government is to be investigated as part of the research to determine the feasibility of a skilled migrant program. The program would equip new migrants with skills to apply for jobs, prepare a CV, interview skills etc. Once research complete the program can be promoted at citizenship ceremonies, Chinese language schools, advertising in Cityview, Christian Community Aid etc. Initially 15 people would be needed to commence the program.
