Widening Participation Carolina Morison from Macquarie University gave a presentation to the group on Noted ways Macquarie University is widening the participation of students at the university:-Carolina is a planning officer at the University She designs projects and initiatives to be representative of everyone in society The aim is to give everyone the same opportunities in the university community It is recognised that the uni isn't representative of everyone in society - the main hurdle faced by students is often financial. This issue isn't unique to Australia. All countries face challenges in relation to the people who can access higher education. Macquarie University is 50 years old. It was established at a time of great social change and has always been modern in its outlook. Equity in education raises educational outcomes and increases living standards. Many groups suffer disadvantage such as low income earners, CALD community, rural students etc. All universities are being encouraged to work with students from areas of disadvantage. There has been an increase in participation in higher education of between 9 – 13% for students considered to be disadvantaged. Programs have been developed to build confidence and let people reach their potential. The programs have achieved improved greater outcomes The Committee was asked to consider how the community can engage more and provide education support to people who need it. Westminster Park Masterplan 4. The Masterplan has been contentious in the local area The information was noted. The ground is not in great condition but it is used passively by many locals. The Masterplan suggestion is for a synthetic surface to be installed and some people don't like this. Monash Park – opposite Westminster Park is also to be redeveloped.
