- Ryde Progress Association wants to support people who live near Shepherd's Bay Centre
- There are a number of elderly people in this area who mind their grandchildren but the carers are lonely.
- RPA will arrange a morning tea on an informal basis.
- It is hoped it might spread to other small shopping centres and provide a sense of inclusion as there are many lonely people
- A webinar will be held in Seniors Week which will feature grandparents who mind grandchildren.
