State government funding for advocacy in the area of disability support will soon cease and Council has lobbied against this. There is a need to identify impediments and advocate to Council, businesses etc where issues are identified. The removal of state government bus stops was recently raised at Council as this will impact people who have difficulty travelling to stops further away Council has also called for additional bus services to support areas with currently limited services.
