

It pays to go sustainable



Eco Home Challenge



They booked a free, 45-minute Home Sustainability Assessment and entered the Ryde Sustainable Home Challenge. They were one of three lucky residents to win home environmental improvement items valued at \$1,500. A new rooftop solar system is proving it pays to go solar.

Since 2013, over 400 residents have signed up for the sustainability assessment.

Gone Solar

Council has installed a 32.5 kw solar energy system on the roof of North Ryde

The system is expected to generate 47,002 kw/h of clean, renewable electricity per annum, enough electricity to meet almost 70% of its energy needs.

The project will reduce greenhouse gas emissions by close to 41,000 tonnes per annum, the equivalent of permanently removing 16.6 cars off the road every year.

The 126 solar panels have been installed at a fixed angle and face north to maximise their efficiency.

Despite the current uncertainty surrounding the proposed amalgamation of Ryde Council, I can assure you that Ryde is on course for a period of unprecedented growth.



WORKS IN THE CITY

PROGRAM OF WORKS

Keeping roads and footpaths in good condition and ensuring that local parks, playgrounds, sporting facilities and public buildings are maintained to a high standard, requires a constant cycle of works and planning. Between January 2017 and February 2017 more than \$4.25 million was allocated for this vital work. Here is a monthly breakdown of completed projects for the quarter. BOAT PARKING LAWS CONSULTATION 2017

New Boat Trailer Parking Laws were introduced in NSW in late 2016 to allow Councils and impounding authorities to take action against boat trailers parked in the same spot on a residential street for more than 28 days. These laws do not automatically apply in every part of NSW. Councils are required to consult with their communities and then determine whether or not to enforce the new boat parking laws.
