Details Action 1. Welcome, Apologies and Introductions CIr Yedelian welcomed those in attendance. Noted. Those in attendance and apologies are as above. CIr Yedelian asked Jonathan to chair the meeting as he was unable to access the agenda. Jonathan provided an acknowledgement of Country. Hassib advised he would need to leave the meeting to attend a church service following the death of his sister in law. 2. **Previous Minutes** The minutes of the previous meeting held on 26th November 2020 were Noted. confirmed. Hassib asked for a further breakdown of the statistics from the Citizenship Ceremony. Jonathan will send through this information. 4. IMPACT OF COVID – update on COVID restrictions and use of Council facilities From 12th February 2021, new COVID limits for events were announced. The information was noted. Since then, COVID restrictions have changed again and Jonathan will send the latest updates to everyone Jonathan is on a working party which will help provide information about the COVID vaccine to CALD communities. He will also send this information to members of this committee so they can disseminate it through their communities. Alice noted that information will need to be provided to international students and others to inform them they can be vaccinated free of charge. 5. Guest Speaker – The Men's Table (men's support group) The guest speaker, Ben Hughes, was not able to attend but Jonathan provided an update as follows: The focus of the group is wellbeing and suicide prevention Men report higher levels of loneliness than women The information was noted. A lot of depression in men is caused by work stress The men's table group meet for a meal and drink and discuss what is happening in their lives They get together on a regular basis and use a prescriptive manner for conducting conversations

It is not about ideology The group would like to set up a Men's Table in Ryde and would like to see diversity of culture represented A meeting will be held on 22nd March 2021 where people can find out about the initiative Although men experience some things in common eg parenthood, it takes on different perspectives when different cultural backgrounds are included. Jonathan will send through the link to the initial meeting. There is a cost which covers the meal. People can book to attend through the link Guest Speaker - City of Ryde inclusive parks design Rob Parsonson from Council's Parks Team provided the following information: Since 2019. Council has used a State Govt guideline to make The information was noted sure the children's playgrounds it provides are inclusive. Now trying to make all parks and sports fields inclusive Looking to this group for information about barriers to different groups in using playing fields and other areas Strategies being developed for the next twenty years Staff would like to put questions to the CALD community and its reps to ensure that open space and facilities are open and inclusive to all Have looked at data at a state level as it isn't available at a local level In City of Ryde, most popular activities are well attended by all groups given the state average and the participation rate is often higher than state average Concerned with the population groups that are often underrepresented in structured sport- eg females, people over 65, low socio economic groups, disabled, people from CALD backgrounds. Need to address the barriers of constraint eg personal health barriers, social barriers, facility barriers – due to design, environmental barriers, how well treed areas are, do they encourage incidental activity? Council has the ability to reduce some of the constraints through direct or indirect approaches Eg could offer low impact sports, low cost programs. Safar noted that there are few dedicated walking tracks – most are shared and it is dangerous for walkers when they have to share with cyclists Maybe include bike committee in this discussion Could Committee members discuss this issue with their contacts and provide Rob with responses by the end of March Jonathan to send Rob the contact details of the Committee members

Politicians and multicultural ambassadors attended CMRC has opened an office in Top Ryde and is setting up a roster so the ambassadors can begin assisting people. Also working with ambassadors towards Harmony Day (20th March) - performances, stories, cooking events etc Clr Yedelian thanked all involved with the Taste of Diversity event There are a number of languages supported by the ambassadors In future, MAC members are to be invited to all events such as the Taste of Diversity event. Make a stand against racism Alice provided the following update Pamphlet has been completed Will continue the campaign to raise awareness on campus as students return COR is encouraged to support the "racism not welcome" program which puts up street signs stating racism is not Both the "racism not welcome" program and "welcoming cities program" were considered by Council at its meeting of 23rd February 2021. At Council's September 2020 meeting, Council adopted the "unity over fear" program and agreed to seek support to have 100,000 sign a petition decrying anti-Chinese sentiment Contact to be made with Steve Khouw of the Chinese Australian Forum. He is to be asked for an update on the petition and to address the next meeting of this committee. 8. **Working Parties** Harmony Day There will be two events held for Harmony Day. The information was noted. There will be a breakfast for community organisations and community leaders on 19th March 2021 and a virtual event held on 20th March 2021.
