<p><b>2. Follow up From Previous Minutes and adoption of minutes</b></p> <p>The minutes from the meeting held on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2016 were confirmed and endorsed.</p>	<p>The previous minutes were confirmed and adopted.</p>	
<p><b>3. Update on Council relocation and amalgamations</b></p> <p>No further advice since the last meeting of this committee. Court cases are continuing. KPMG reports relied on by the State Government have been called into question and are being examined by legal teams. The judge hearing the case is now on leave so no decision expected until at least August.</p>	<p>Noted</p>	
<p><b>4. Guest speaker – Christene Squires – Australian Bureau of Statistics – August Census</b></p> <p>9<sup>th</sup> August 2016 is National Census night. The Census will look at population and dwellings ie the type of dwelling is being counted ie homeless, living in unit, house etc.</p> <p>Homeless are counted with assistance of groups such as Salvation Army and food van operators who look in well known areas such as local parks. Sometimes the homeless are counted by observation ie a male of approx. age.</p> <p>People of all ages are counted. People visiting from other countries on census night are counted.</p> <p>The Census provides a picture of the population on that night. Helps determine the facilities and amenities needed by the population.</p> <p>61 questions. – age, sex, marital status, country of birth, work you do, income, number of hours, qualifications, transport to work,</p> <p>You can't identify people by the information provided on the form. All information is confidential and not able to be shared with other government agencies.</p> <p>Statistical data only.</p> <p>The form is to be completed on line if possible this year</p>	<p>A request was made that members of the Youth Council spread the word amongst their friends regarding the census and its importance.</p>

NSW Youth Council Conference 2017 – update 22<sup>nd</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup> Sept 2017</b></p> <p>The group met yesterday to work on the agenda for this event.</p> <p>Speakers, guidelines, activities now determined. After each speaker will be an activity based on the topic covered.</p> <p>Next meeting 12<sup>th</sup> July when activities to be determined.</p> <p>Trying to arrange tours to technological companies and groups during the event. Trying to work out how to make this relevant to the group rather than just good fun for those attending.</p> <p>Invitations to speakers being issued.</p> <p>Youth Opportunity grant is being applied for. <p><b>8.
