RYDE TO REACH 100% RENEWABLE ENERGY TARGET EARLY



The City of Ryde will reach its 100 percent renewable energy target eight years ahead of schedule after it joined 24 other councils to enter into one of the largest renewable energy deals ever for local government.

Worth approximately \$180 million, the retail electricity agreement led by the Southern Sydney Regional Organisation of Councils (SSROC) and energy retailer ZEN Energy will deliver more than 214 gigawatt hours per year to the City of Ryde and other participating councils.

Overall, 83 percent of the total electricity supply under the agreement will be covered by renewable energy from the Moree, Hillston and Nevertire Solar Farms, which are all located within NSW.

The City of Ryde has opted for 100 percent renewable energy under the agreement. This commitment will mean the City of Ryde will reach its 100 percent renewable energy target this year – eight years before its initial target date of 2030.

In total, the agreement led by SSROC and ZEN Energy involves the supply of electricity to more than 300 major council facilities, more than 210,000 streetlights and more than 3,000 small sites managed by councils. It will run until 2026 with an option to extend to 2030.

Bicycle Strategy and Action Plan Endorsed

Council recently endorsed our Bicycle Strategy 2022-2030 and the Ryde Action Plan 2022-2030.

The purpose of the updated strategy and action plan is to provide a more modern framework and set of principles for the planning, design, improvement and management of Council's network of pathways and trails.

It also provides a framework for encouraging greater involvement of residents, community organisations and government in the development of walking, cycling and other pathway-related activities and opportunities.

Voting Compulsory for Eligible West Ward Residents in By-election

Do you live in Denistone, Denistone East, Denistone West, Eastwood, Macquarie Park, Marsfield, Melrose Park or West Ryde? Areas of these suburbs fall within City of Ryde's West Ward.

If you are eligible to vote in New South Wales and live in the City of Ryde's West Ward, you must vote in this by-election, being held on Saturday 15 October for the election of one Councillor for this Ward.

If you are not enrolled in West Ward, you cannot vote at the by-election.

This election is being administered by the NSW Electoral Commission.

The vacancy has occurred due to the resignation of one Councillor.

Pre-poll opens on Tuesday 4 October and closes on Friday 14 October 2022.

A free, online compost and worm farming education program

Compost Connection is a free online education program in association with Tumbleweed to assist City of Ryde residents to successfully establish and maintain a compost bin or worm farm.

The program will take you step-by-step through the whole process, from establishing and maintaining your compost bin or worm farm, to harvesting and using the compost produced to fertilise your garden.

City of Ryde residents who complete our online courses will receive a 50 percent discount voucher to purchase a compost bin or worm farm from Council. Please note there is a limit of one compost bin and one worm farm voucher per household.

We hope the program provides residents with the knowledge and confidence to get started on their composting and worm farming journey.

Spring is the perfect time to get out there to reduce, reuse, remove, recycle or resale. So here's to a happy decluttering experience this spring!

WEED WATCH RYDE

What's that weed?

I am a fern-like herbaceous plant with many arching stems up to 2m long.

I have pale green cladodes that look like short flat leaves (up to 2.5cm long and up to 0.3cm wide), which are tapered to a fine short point.

My "leaves" grow in clusters of 1-5 along my stems.

My green to brown stems arise from a central crown that sits below the soil surface. My older stems will have short stiff spines (up to 10mm long).

My roots are fleshy, consisting of white watery tubers up to 3cm long. My flowers are white to pink (5mm in diameter) and I fruit in round berries (up to 8mm wide) that are green when young and glossy red when mature.

I can reproduce by seed and underground crowns. The best way to remove me from your garden is by manually cutting out my crown from the soil and removing my fruiting stems before they mature.

APPLE CRUMBLE RECIPE

Cooking with the Country Women's Association



Get in the Granny Smith spirit with some apple crumble thanks to the Country Women's Association (CWA)!

Congratulations to the CWA, which celebrated their 100th anniversary in 2022.

Ingredients

For crumble:

- 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 cup/4oz plain flour
- 1 cup/3oz rolled oats
- ¾ cup or 6oz brown sugar

For filling:

- 6 medium Granny Smith apples
- 2/3 cup or 2oz caster sugar
- ½ tsp ground cinnamon
- Juice of 1-2 lemons

Steps

1. Set oven to 190 degrees Celsius.
2. Cut up apples into quarters. Halve again and cut out cores and strip off peel from apples. Slice thinly into bowl and squeeze on lemon juice to prevent apples from browning.
3. Put flour, rolled oats, brown sugar in another bowl and stir thoroughly to ensure it's all blended together.
4. Add cinnamon.
5. Add chopped butter into mixture and rub the dry mixture in with the butter, pressing with your fingers so it is well mixed.
6. Rub butter around the inside of the baking dish.
7. Put apple into bottom of the dish and pack firmly. Add caster sugar and mix in. Add sprinkling of cinnamon on top.
8. Press sugar/oat/flour mixture firmly on top of the apples.
9. Cook for approximately 35 minutes until browned on top.

City of Ryde has become one of the first councils in New South Wales to launch real-time parking availability for accessible parking spaces through the Park'nPay app, making it easy for those living with disability to find a spot anywhere in the City.

This is one of many exciting features of the NSW Government's Park'nPay app, which was launched in the City of Ryde in February 2022 in Macquarie Park. The app allows motorists to pay for and top up existing parking online using their smartphone. They can also search for on-street parking spaces in Macquarie Park, and at Council's newly opened Rowe Street East carpark, in real time.

Zero Barriers

New accessible facilities at Ryde Aquatic Leisure Centre



Two new adult change tables have recently been installed in the disabled/family change rooms, as well as hoist systems in the Leisure Pool at Ryde Aquatic Leisure Centre. The tables and hoist provide a safer and more private environment for carers to assist special needs customers in both showering and getting changed.

A portable pool deck hoist is available to assist carers in lifting and retrieving their clients from either the Competition or Program pools. The hoist is totally portable and removes barriers in accessing these pools by eliminating the need for manual lifting and allows carers to raise or lower a client with a single button control from either within or out of the water.

CITY OF RYDE BUSINESS

Why City of Ryde is a great place to do business

Featuring one of New South Wales' largest business districts – Macquarie Park – and significant education and training institutions – such as the new Meadowbank Education and Employment Precinct, Meadowbank TAFE and Macquarie University – City of Ryde is the perfect place to work and do business.

In 2021, the City recorded the highest new business growth in the last 10 years, with close to 2,000 new micro, small and medium-sized businesses (MSMEs) setting up shop. It also saw three times the Greater Sydney average in terms of jobs growth.

Business growth benefits the community as it leads to more local jobs and opportunities, enhanced shopping experiences, increased choice of goods and services, and improved lifestyle and life satisfaction.

Ryde is fast becoming a desired location for MSMEs, with the current growth continuing to be driven by the professional services (including science and technology) and construction sectors.

Knowledge-intensive sectors are seeing the greatest growth (at 7 percent) compared with other regions in Sydney, which actually saw a decline in growth in 2021.

Our young people are also benefitting from job opportunities. City of Ryde boasts a significantly lower youth (aged 15-24 years) unemployment rate than Greater Sydney. Sitting at 8.5 percent in 2021, this compares to 13.3 percent across Greater Sydney.

KISSING POINT PARK UPGRADE COMPLETE

PUTNEY

Fishermen and boaters will enjoy the new features at Kissing Point Park in Putney.

The boat ramp was widened to accommodate two cars with trailers for the launching and retrieval of boats. A new groyne was also developed to provide protection from waves and help boat ramp users.

You can clean your catch at the new fish cleaning table or give the boat a rinse off at the washdown facilities.

The new amenities building provides improved access with male, female and accessible toilet facilities available.

The delivery of these park upgrades was made possible through support from Transport for NSW via the NSW Boating Now Program.



The City of Ryde delivers an ambitious program of works to meet the needs of our growing City. Details of projects recently completed or underway are detailed below.

ELS Hall Park Amenities Building and Field 3 Upgrade

In response to community feedback, ELS Hall Park in North Ryde has undergone a raft of upgrades, including a new amenities building and improvements to Field 3.

The new amenities building includes player change rooms and showers, a referee room, canteen, storage rooms and public unisex toilets including an accessible toilet.

The Field 3 upgrade features terraced spectator seating, connecting paths and stairs, new fencing, a groundskeeper storage shed, cricket nets, shelter with picnic facilities and new floodlights.

Accessible Bus Stop Improvement Project

A project is underway to make public transport in the City of Ryde more accessible to those living with disability. One way that Council is doing this is by ensuring all bus stops are compliant with the Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002 under the *Disability Discrimination Act (DDA)*.

Council has committed to a five-year plan to ensure all bus stops in the City of Ryde are DDA-compliant.

Some examples of improvements include wheelchair waiting space, tactile ground surface indicators, seamless transition between the bus stop and footpath or road, and level boarding points. The replacement of bus stop seats with new aluminium seats, while not mandatory for DDA compliance, will mean a better experience and comfort for commuters waiting for a bus at these bus stops.

“Disposing of waste is a part of everyday life and my role is to help residents utilise the wonderful services provided by the City of Ryde. These services have been designed to ensure waste is managed efficiently, safely, and with the best environmental outcomes. If we all engage in best practice waste management our waterways and local environment will stay clean and healthy.

Educating residents, reviewing opportunities for bin infrastructure and investigating illegal dumping are all components of my rewarding role at Council.”

Submissions must be made in writing to the Chief Executive Officer and lodged within the exhibition time frame indicated in a letter you may have received from us or on our website.

Your written submission must identify the DA number, relate directly to the work proposed, and clearly state any comments or concerns you have with the development.
